



- •Contracted to July 2007, Being extended to Dec 2007

- •Plans to form MED consortium



When TEIN2 began... (April 2004)



Connect. Communicate. Collaborate

- Diverse partners
 - Beneficiaries: China, Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines, Thailand,
 Vietnam
 - Non-beneficiaries: Brunei, Japan, Korea, Singapore
- National research and education networking varying from advanced to non-existent
- Some bilateral intra-Asia links, mainly provided by JP and KR; one bilateral link AP-EU
- Communicative but competitive partner relationships
- Telecommunication markets vary from competitive to monopolistic
- 10M Euro RELEX funding









Planning Studies (Phase 1) April – November 2004



- Scope:
 - NREN status and plans
 - Telecommunications market analysis
 - Scope for network capacity donations
 - Cost-sharing model
 - Project representation and governance
- 4 project meetings held
- 100% EC funding
- Co-ordinated by DANTE







Tender Stage (Phase 2A) Dec 2004 – Dec 2005+



- Tenders conducted by DANTE under EU Procurement rules with negotiated procedures
- Connectivity tender process
 - Contract notice published, no pre-defined topology
 - Information Events held in London and Bangkok
 - Tender dossier sent to 43 suppliers, 24 responses
 - 13 shortlisted for clarifications and negotiations
 - Contracts awarded to 4 Asian and 2 EU suppliers
- NOC Tender
 - Similar process, 5 responses
- All partners contributed 12K Euro towards Phase 2A
- Partner meetings to review progress and agree final topology







Network Operational Phase (Jan 2006 to Dec 2007, and being extended to Aug 2008) Phase 2B



- Network started up progressively Jan May 2006
- Emphasis shifted to:
 - Stimulating network usage
 - Training engineers of beneficiary NRENs
 - Sustainability beyond 2007!
- Project funded via EC, beneficiary subscriptions, nonbeneficiary contributions (money, capacity)



Enabling and promoting applications



- Tele-medecine well established, all TEIN2 partners participated for first time during Manila APAN Jan 2007
- Earth Monitoring e.g. Disaster warning, Oceanography,
 Climatology. High potential areas.
- E-learning
- E-Heritage
- E-Science e.g collaborations between Europe and China (incl EU/China TEIN2 link now upgraded to 2.5 Gbps via Project ORIENT)











TEIN3 (after mid 2008)

- All TEIN2 partners want the network to be maintained and grow
 - Endorsed by ASEM6 Summit in Helsinki (Sept 2006)
 - Endorsed by ASEM ICT Ministers in Ha Noi (Dec 2006)
- Follow on project being planned ('TEIN3')
 - to follow TEIN2 seamlessly from Sept 2008
 - Possible geographical expansion to S Asia
 - Network will be re-tendered
 - Initially run by DANTE, with responsibility transitioned over time to Asian ownership
- Funding package being developed:
 - Further EC funding being discussed, reducing over time
 - Increasing funding shares from existing beneficiaries
 - Non-beneficiaries contributions being discussed









Achievements

- First regional Asian R&E network: partners recognise benefit of regional-level collaboration
- Additional partners keen to join
- Traffic growing and user communities forming
- National NREN development catalysed in all beneficiary countries
- Strong political endorsement
