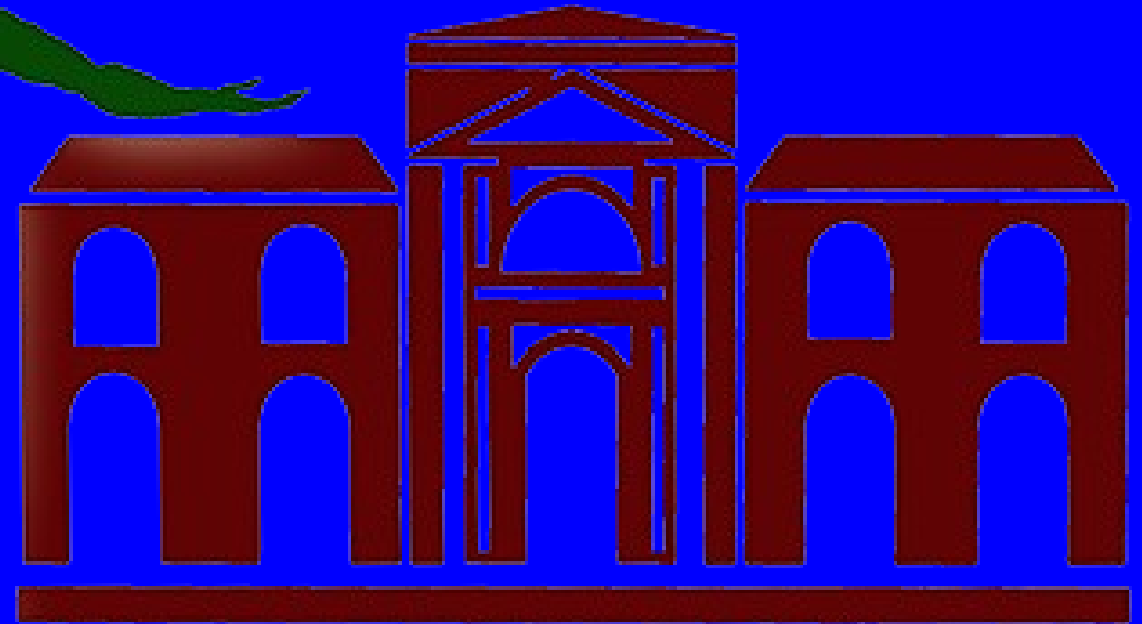

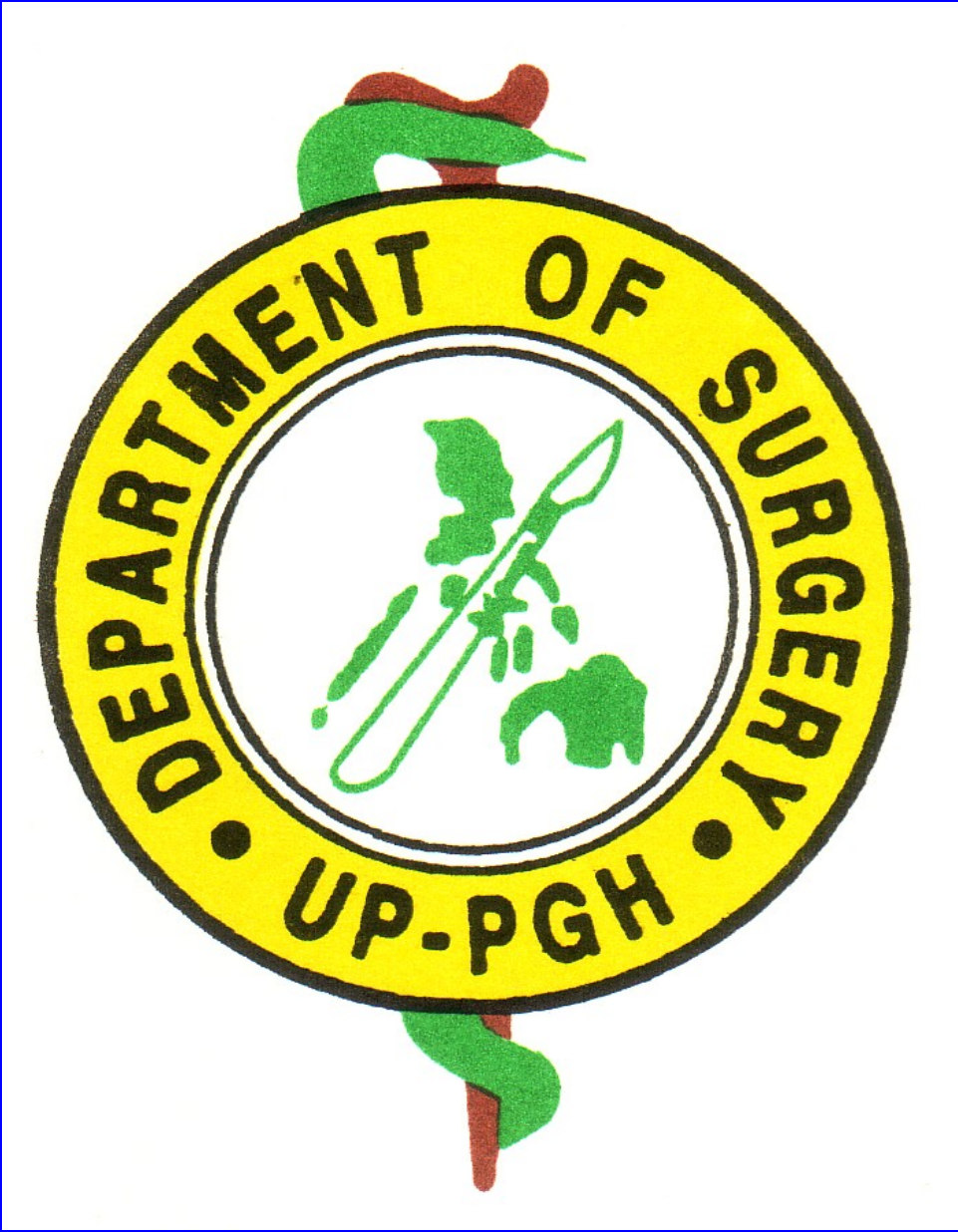

Advanced network technologies are changing the way surgeries are conducted. It is now possible to do real-time medical consultations and live surgical demonstrations between two or more remote hospitals.

The medical session of the Asia Pacific Advanced Network (APAN) meetings has been one of the most interesting sessions during this bi-annual gathering of APAN-member countries since it started broadcasting live surgical demonstrations remotely. In the recently held 24th APAN Meeting in Xi'an, China, a number of surgical demonstrations were conducted and broadcasted live to different remote sites in other countries.

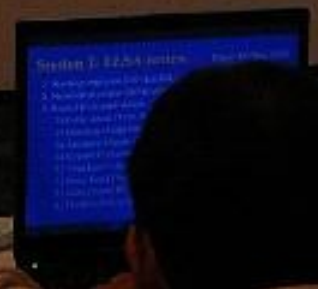

Other remote sites included Tokyo Medical Dental University (Japan), National University of Singapore (Singapore), Tata Memorial Hospital (Mumbai, India), Concord Repatriation General Hospital (Sydney, Australia), University of Bordeaux (Bordeaux, France), and Sheraton Xi'an Hotel (24th APAN Meeting venue).
